DIRECTORS' REPORT

for the period 01 April 2008 to 31 March 2009
Presented at the 11th Annual General Meeting

Dear Members,

On behalf of the Board of Directors, It gives us an immense pleasure in extending a warm welcome to you all to the 11th Annual General Meeting of our Association.

Our Association was constituted in the year 1998 to create awareness among our members about the measures and policies impacting them in electricity, to represent the views of our members to the statutory bodies, to represent member's problems in the regional grievance meetings of Tamilnadu Electricity Board in all the regions and to take up the issues, if required at the court of law. We hope that we have taken part in your electricity related grievance, and done our best, to resolve the problems to a great extent.

Electricity - a great invention of humankind is an essential requirement for all facets of our life and has been recognized as a basic human need. Electricity is the most critical sector of the economy.

The Indian economy is growing at one of the fastest rates in the world. This has lead to high demand for additional energy, in particular electricity - growing at 9 percent every year. India's electricity consumption is ranked sixth globally and third in Asia with 606 units per capita consumption per annum. It is set to increase to 1,000 units per annum by 2012. The power generation capacity has to grow by at least 10 percent to sustain the current GDP growth of 9 percent, say industry experts. Ideally, they say, the ratio of energy generation and GDP growth should be 1:1.

The government has set an ambitious capacity addition target of 78,557 mw during the country's 11th five-year economic plan period (2007-12). The envisaged capacity addition of over 76,000 mw comprises 58,644 mw or 75 percent in thermal, 16,553 mw or 21 percent in hydropower and 3,380 mw or 4 percent in nuclear power. Currently, 44,000 mw is under construction.

In India, the total installed Capacity as on 31.12.2008 1,47,402.81 MW. Capacity Addition Target during 11th Plan is 78700MW.

About 76% of the electricity consumed in India is generated by thermal power plants, Current installed capacity of Thermal Power (as of 12/2008) is **93,392.64 MW** which is 63.3% of total installed capacity. Out of this

- Current installed base of Coal Based Thermal Power is **77,458.88 MW** which comes to 53.3% of total installed base.

- Current installed base of Gas Based Thermal Power is **14,734.01 MW** which is 10.5% of total installed base.
- Current installed base of Oil Based Thermal Power is **1,199.75 MW** which is 0.9% of total installed base.

India was one of the pioneering states in establishing **hydro-electric power** plants, The power plant at Darjeeling and Shimsa (Shivanasamudra) was established in 1898 and 1902 respectively and is one of the first in Asia. The installed capacity **as on 31.12.2008** was approximately **36647.76 MW**. The public sector has a predominant share of 97% in this sector

Current installed capacity of **Renewable energy** is **13,242.41 MW** which is 7.7% of total installed base with the southern state of Tamil Nadu contributing nearly a third of it (4379.64 MW) largely through wind power. As for wind energy, India has emerged as the fifth-largest wind energy producer, in the world.

Nuclear power is the fourth-largest source of electricity in India after thermal, hydro and renewable sources of electricity. As of 2008, India has 17 nuclear power plants in operation generating 4,120 MW while 6 other are under construction and are expected to generate an additional 3,160 MW. India now envisages increasing the contribution of nuclear power to overall electricity generation capacity from 4.2% to 9% within 25 years. In 2010, India's installed nuclear power generation capacity will increase to 6,000 MW. As of 2009, India stands 9th in the world in terms of number of operational nuclear power reactors and is constructing 9 more, including two EPRs being constructed by France's Areva. Indigenous atomic reactors include TAPS-3, and -4, both of which are 540 MW reactors. India's \$717 million fast breeder reactor project is expected to be operational by 2010.

The total numbers of consumers in India are over 144 million

Out of total electricity consumption in India, 34% goes to Industry, 24% to agriculture, 21% to domestic use, 12% to public lighting & 2% to railway traction. These figures do not include captive (i.e. private sector) power generation. Due to shortage of electricity, power cuts are common throughout India and this has adversely effected the country's economic growth.

India has set itself an ambitious target of providing electric power for the entire nation by the year 2012. The country's National Electricity Policy wants the entire billion plus population to have access to power by 2012 and to raise the per capita availability of electricity by nearly 50 percent.

In Tamil Nadu, with rapid industrial growth and pouring investments, the demand for power has gone up significantly. The state has more than 2 crore consumer base, the highest in India and is ranked as one of the top three industrialized and urbanized states in the country.

Tamil Nadu has 19.6 million consumers, of which 6,812 are HT service, 471,040 industrial services, 2,374,525 commercial, 1,851,358 agricultural services and 13,207,989 domestic services.

However, the addition to capacity has been modest and has not kept pace with the growing demand. Though the government has initiated some projects to expand the capacity at its existing thermal power stations, it has clearly not been enough. The state has a deficit of power and it is estimated to be around 11.9% as on Feb 2009.

Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has a total installed capacity of 10,214 MW which includes Central share and Independent Power Producers. Whereas the demand is 11,622 Mw, which leaves a deficit of 1,500Mw. During peak hours, it can rise to 1,700 Mw. The shortage has led the state government to implement a 40% cut for industrial units and commercial establishments on the high-tension network and 20 % for low-tension connections from 1st November 2008.

Global economic turmoil and Severe power shortage has hit industrial production in Tamil Nadu. Industry feels production could be down as much as 30 per cent. Every sector of the state is affected. Sectors like textile, leather and salt appear to be among the worst hit.

India has suffered a loss of \$8.64 billion (Rs.43, 205 crore) in the power downturn in the year 2008-2009, says a study by the Manufacturers' Association for Information Technology (MAIT) and Emerson Network Power (India). The study was an in-depth analysis of the impact of downtime in corporate India due to high occurrence of power outages, loss incurred are scheduled and non scheduled expenses, which is just double the loss incurred in the year 2003, when it was only Rs.22, 000 crore. The loss incurred is about one percent of India's total GDP.

Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (TNEB) incurred a financial loss of Rs 6,000 crore during 2008-09 and it is estimated to increase by 10 per cent during 2009-10. The loss of revenue due to 40 per cent power cut to industrial consumers was a significant factor.

The situation is little improved now with the power cut being reduced to 20% from 15th June 2009.

The state Government should take effective steps to end the power crisis and start more power generation units in the coming years,

The power-starved state of Tamil Nadu, which had not commissioned any major power project after 1996, has lined up a slew of power projects for over 14,000 mw generation capacity in public and private sectors. These projects are expected to make the state power sufficient by 2011 and power surplus after 2012.

The new power projects for over 11,500 mw in public sector and 2,500 mw in private sector are at different stages of implementation. The first unit of the 2,000-mw Kudankulam atomic power project is also close to the stage of being commissioned. The first 1,000 mw unit of the Kudankulam atomic power project was scheduled to go on stream in December 2009.

Of the thermal projects, about 6,000 mw would be commissioned in 2010-11 by the public sector power companies as joint ventures with the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (TNEB), It includes 1,200-mw expansion of North Chennai and 600-mw expansion of Mettur thermal stations, TNEB-National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) joint venture 1500-mw Vallur thermal project, TNEB-Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) joint venture 1600-mw Udangudi super critical thermal power project and TNEB- Neyveli Lignite Corporation (NLC) 1000-mw joint venture at Tuticorin. The work on 1,000-mw Vallur thermal power project is at the stage of progress. Its capacity can be expanded by another 500 mw. It is the first NTPC project in Tamil Nadu though it supplies 1,492 mw

to the state from Ramagundam in Andhra Pradesh and Kayamkulam in Kerala. The unit-1 at Vallur would be ready by November 2010 and the later by March 2011.

Foundation stone was laid for the super critical 1,600 mw (800x2) Udangudi thermal power project near Tiruchendur, in Tuticorin district, recently. TNEB is teaming up with NLC to set up a coal-based 1,000 mw power project at Tuticorin. The foundation stone for this was laid on February 28 by the external affairs minister Pranab Mukherjee.

There is a proposal to set up 4,000-mw mega power project at Cheyyur, Kancheepuram district. The Power Finance Corporation is taking the lead in this.

NLC proposes to set up a 1600 mw project at Jayamkondam, Perambalur These two projects will be commissioned after 2012.

However the shortfall can only tackled by conserving power. Substations should be equipped with capacitors so that loss of power is minimized to a certain extent. If the government proposed to supply a single CFL lamp to the consumer will save 250MW of electricity. Let us hope the Government will take effective steps to produce & conserve the energy and thus to growth of our state.

We are pleased to present our report for the year ending 31.03.2009.

1. TECA Representations and Litigations

TECA has represented the problems of member industries and has participated in all the meetings and discussions in the matter of electricity during the year. Consistent representations were made to the Government of Tamilnadu, Electricity Board & Regulatory Commission.

1.1 TECA had filed a writ petition before the Madras High Court

- a) To challenge the enactment passed by the Tamilnadu legislative Assembly to invalidate the effect of the Supreme Court Judgement on electricity tax on Maximum Demand and
- b) To seek refund or adjustment of electricity tax paid by members on Maximum Demand for the period from 15.06.2003 till this date.

Madras High Court has admitted the two writ petition filed by us and have granted interim injunction. A copy of the same was sent to all members advising them to remit the Electricity Tax on MD charges 'UNDER PROTEST' by a Separate cheque with a covering letter stating that they are paying the e-tax on MD charges 'UNDER PROTEST' in view of the Madras High Court Order.

As advised by our Advocate we have requested the members to file writ individually. We have received vast support from the members and 54 individual writs were filed.

1.2 TECA had advised members to send a claim proposal to the concerned Superintending Engineer, Consumer Grievance Redressal Forum to claim refund of the e-tax paid on MD for the period from 01.01.1991 to 15-06-2003 since the Act (12) 2003, came into existence on 16/06/2003.

1.3 Since the CGRF has not functioning in many regions and delay in getting the feedback from the forum TECA has decided to file a writ before the High Court and get a direction directing the appropriate Consumer Grievance Redressal Commission to take up the matters and to dispose the matters on merits.

TECA has also sent representations to the Chief Engineer of all regions, to the Chairman, to the Member Distribution & the respective District Collectors to form the Consumer Forum. And after our repeated representation, TNEB is taking steps to form the CGRF and we are happy to note that many regions are in the process of constituting the forum in many circles.

Our Treasurer Mr. N. Visvanathan has been nominated as member of CGRF-South

1.4 We have advised our members to file petitions with the electricity ombudsman to direct Electricity Board to refund the E-Tax paid on Maximum Demand charges for the period 1.01.1991 to 15.06.2003.

Five of our members are filed their Writ and the cases are being processed.

1.5 Our President attended the Public Hearing conducted by TNERC in the matter of restriction and control of power supply and levy of excess demand charges & energy charges for the exceeding quota.

1.6 Due to our representation, Tamilnadu Electricity Board has announced vide their Internal Memo No. CE/Comml/EE/DSM/AEE/PMM/F. Power Cut/D.026/08, dt. 17.11.08 that the consumers having Group Companies under the same management have been permitted to transfer their quota between their various units, stipulating some conditions:

1.7 Our Vice President Mr. Arvind Gupta attended the meeting. called by Hon'ble Minister for Electricity Shri. Arcot. N. Veerasamy to discuss the power situation in Tamilnadu on 29/12/2008 at the Secretariat, Chennai.
